Because the EEOICPA is an Occupational Illness Compensation Program, you must have a verified diagnosis. This simply means that not only has your doctor diagnosed you with cancer or a chronic illness, but you also have the biopsy report or test results confirming the illness.

Could your illness have been caused by something you were exposed to at a DOE site?

To file your illness, it must have a root cause from radiation, chemicals, heavy metals, fumes, etc. The DOL follows the Centers for Disease Control guidelines on causation so you might start by checking out their website, by talking to your doctor, or by calling your local Community Outreach Manager.

Did your work process put you in contact with radiation or other hazardous materials/chemicals that could be the root cause of your illness?

The DOL will need to verify that your work did, in fact, put you in contact with the radiation, chemicals, heavy metals, fumes, etc. that caused your illness. We can help you determine if your illness is linked to your workplace exposure.

If you can answer YES to all 3 questions, you are ready to file for benefits!
